Dear Faithful in Christ,

Christmas is getting near, and beginning Dec. 17th, the liturgy reflects this fact. As you know, priests, deacons, and professed religious are required to pray the Divine Office, also known as the Liturgy of the Hours. The principal prayer in the morning is called “Lauds” – “Praises” – and the principal prayer in the afternoon, ideally said at sunset, is “Vespers” – “Evening Prayer.”

Every Vespers includes the Magnificat, the hymn of praise from Our Lady, “My soul doth magnify the Lord,” which we find in the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke. Before and after the Magnificat is a short verse called an “antiphon.” Beginning, Dec. 17th we have the “O Antiphons,” because they all begin with “O,” an exclamation in Latin as it is in English.

The first antiphon begins, “O Sapientia, quae ex ore Altissimi prodiisti,” “O Thou Wisdom, which hast proceeded from the mouth of the Highest,” and the last antiphon, on Dec. 24, begins, “O Emmanuel, Rex et legifer noster,” “O Thou Emmanuel, our King and Lawgiver.” The antiphons are all sung to the same melody, whereas the melodies for the antiphon change from day to day in general.

If we take the next letter after the O at the start of each antiphon, we get S for the first antiphon, and E for the last one. The whole sequence is S A R C O R E. When we take these in reverse order, we get a Latin sentence: “Ero cras” – “I will be [here] tomorrow.”

Tradition has many gems to discover.
